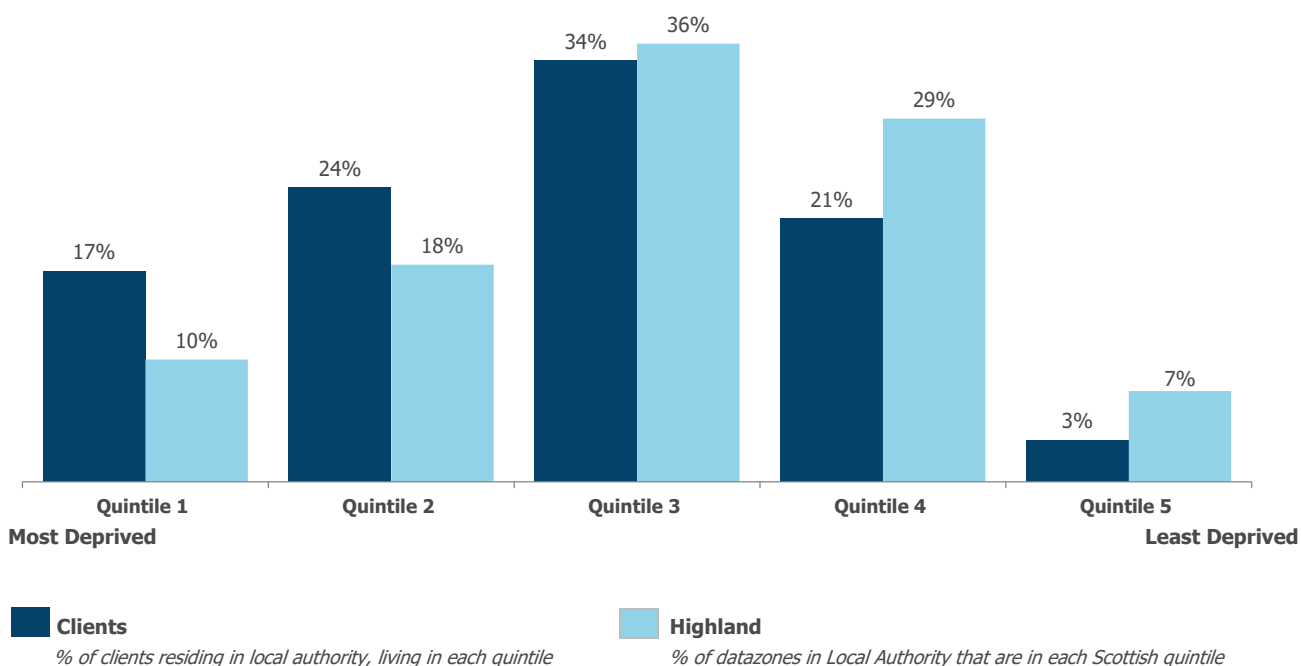

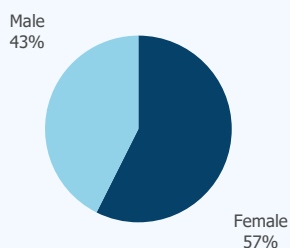
Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation - clients and population residing within Local Authority



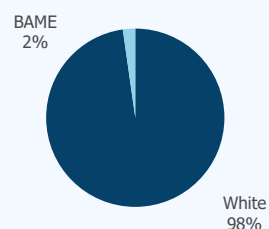
Profile of clients residing within Local Authority

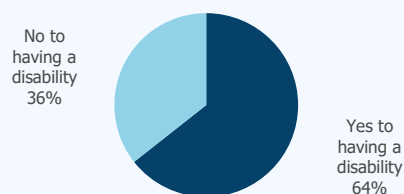
